



## ALPHA TAU FINDS GREAT SUCCESS AT 168TH CONVENTION

Alpha Tau continued its tradition of being one of the nation's top chapters of Beta Theta Pi at this summer's General Convention. The 168<sup>th</sup> General Convention took place at the beautiful Fairmont Scotsdale Princess in Orando, Florida from August 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>, and Alpha Tau received many prestigious awards. More than 1,000 Betas from the U.S. and Canada gathered to celebrate the success of our fraternity.

Our chapter reached new heights of success this year by taking home it's seventh Knox Award. This award is the highest honor given to any chapter within Beta Theta Pi on an international level. With the Alpha Chapter, from Miami, Ohio, not recieving the award, that puts Alpha Tau at the chapter with more Knox awards recieved than any other chapter.

Alpha Tau also took home awards for an outstanding Pledge Education Program, the Virginia Tech Award for excellence in Academics, and an award for Outstanding Recruitment. Our chapter also received awards for Excellence in Risk Management and Campus involvement.

Chapter President Scott Hackman attended convention as the chapter's voting delegate. They were joined by Andy Sevcik, Andrew Hover, Billy Olsen, and Ross Wieting, who all attended the Peter F. Greiner Leadership College. Chapter Counselor Mike Wortman and the notable Alpha Tau Burt Folsom were also in attendance to celebrate our chapter's success.
