

ALPHA TAU WELCOMES 27 NEW BROTHERS

On Saturday January 15th, Alpha Tau welcomed 27 new members to its rolls. The initiation ceremony took place at noon on Saturday, and was followed by the traditional visit to Valentino's buffet by the actives and new initiates

This year's pledge class worked hard during their pledge semester in terms of academics and community service. Four members of the class attained 4.0 GPAs, and had a cumulative GPA of 3.526, much higher than the all university men's average of 2.949 and the all Greek men's average of 3.117.

Pledge Educator, Andrew Dowd (AT 2225), said, "This class was awesome. It was obvious how much they cared about Beta and they showed it by working hard to attain success socially, academically and in the community."

The initiation banquet was held the next day at the Wick Alumni Center across the street from the chapter house. Actives and the new initiates' parents were invited to attend the lunch to celebrate the semester's worth of hard work.

This year's alumni speaker was ex-general fraternity president, Robert Schaupp. Brother Schaupp is the grandfather of this year's honor pledge, Kurt Siebert (AT 2259). In his speech, brother Schuapp spoke of the many accomplishments of Alpha Tau including our 16 Sisson awards and record 9 Knox Awards. Even saying, "It would be hard to argue that Alpha Tau is not one of—if not THE—best Beta chapters in North America."



As well as brother Schaupp, sophomore fellow, Jake Schumacher (AT 2256) and honor pledge, Kurt Siebert spoke. Both spoke of their journeys as out of state students, and the role Beta played in helping them adjust to college life.

After the speakers, all brothers in attendance joined in on the loving cup ceremony. Kurt Seibert said, "It was an awesome end to a great week and great semester."

NEW EXEC MEMBERS ELECTED

ALPHA TAU CONTINUES ACADEMIC SUCCESS

HAS HIGHEST AVERAGE GPA AMONG UNL FRATERNITIES

Beta continued its strive for academic success this past semester. The house claimed an all house average GPA of 3.516. This is the highest GPA the house has achieved in 5 years, and ranked the house number 1 among all fraternities. The GPA was enough to beat out rival Farmhouse who fell short by a hefty margin of .119 (attaining a 3.397).

The all University GPA for males was 2.949,

over a half point lower than Alpha Tau's average. Also, the all-fraternity male average was 3.117, 11.3% lower than the average member of Beta.

The house GPA improved from a 3.451 last semester- con-

tinuing the trend of semester by semester improvement.

The GPA improvement was helped along by a total of 16 perfect, 4.0, GPAs, including 4 from this year's pledge class.

This year's rush chair, Jake Hedgecock said, "Coming in first in grades helps a lot with recruitment. Kids want to join a fraternity they know will

help lead them to academic success. By coming in first we are showing them what is possible if they join Alpha Tau."

Not only does academic success help the house in recruitment but it is also taken notice by faculty on campus. Rahul Batra said, "It's awesome how professors realize the hard work and effort the house puts into school work. It's almost like they hear 'Beta,' and automatically respect you a little more than an average student."

Beta also takes pride in the fact that it has a large diversity of majors, from engineering and business to piano performance and philosophy. This draws many rushees to take a closer look at Beta. Nick Jester, a freshman vocal performance major said, "I was really drawn to Beta because of the fact that my major is so unique. Many times I think fraternities are stereotyped as being all business majors."


The graph featured to the left demostrates this diversity.
